You also may contribute coins or cash in the basket in hall or by check made payable to Central UMC, designated "Bundles of Love."



Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) that lead up to Easter. While there is no mention of Ash Wednesday in the Bible, the Old Testament records acts of repentance or mourning accompanied by symbolic ash and sackcloth. Ashes are a biblical reminder of our mortality: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). The spreading of ashes on foreheads is a visible reminder of "the dying of the old self and the coming to life of the new" The way to Easter is the way of the cross. New life with Christ involves a daily surrendering of the old life. I invite you to **Ash Wednesday Service**, the first step of this Lenten journey, **on February 22nd at 12 pm in the sanctuary.**

Every now and again something comes across my desk that inspires me. This Lenten Program Walk to Jerusalem is one of those things. It is a program to pull together United Methodists from around our Conference. As a pastor, I know perfectly well that most of our churches in the Mountain Sky Conference would love to know that they are not alone in this big world.

That they are not the only voice praising the name of Jesus and working in his name to glorify God's Kin-dom.

So, you say, are we really going to walk to Jerusalem. Yes, sort of. Anytime from January 15-April 8, 2023 we can participate with our conference to walk from Denver to Jerusalem, as a means to increase the health of our own and collective body, mind, and spirit. This is a journey of 8,394 miles which we will work together to accomplish. Our church will start on Ash Wednesday, April 22nd.

It's pretty simple really. We have a team at our church who will make sure the program is a success. All we need is for each of us to keep track of how many steps you take each week and report your mileage or steps to an appointed person in our church (Central UMC). They will then record your steps on the conference step calculator. We will then pray that all who are participating will record enough steps to make it to Jerusalem by Easter!

Collecting steps is supposed to be as easy and we need it to be. But, before I get to that here's the really fun stuff about this program. It is more than just counting your steps. It is a Lenten Devotional. The overall focus of the devotional is kindness and each week we will receive via email a one-page devotional. There are several dimensions to the devotional, including

Scripture and Message and a kindness challenge

the kindness challenges.

If you access this online, a link to a children's book YouTube video We hope that families will watch the story together and discuss it afterwards.

and for those who like some back-ground music for their devotional time, a list of recommendations and link to the Spotify playlist put together specially for each week's scripture and message.

Now, about counting your steps. Some of us have watches, or cell-phone that automatically count our steps, but for those of us who don't, counting can be easy. Estimate, or calculate how many steps you think you've done each. Or, have someone else in your extended family doing the walking for you. It would be a great way to engage our families living afar. It will be fun to see how far Central can make it to Jerusalem on her own. We hope to see you on the trail and remember to put your hiking boots on and bring some water for the journey to Jerusalem.

The Central United Methodist Men meet the second Saturday of every month. They offer fellowship, a chance to be involved, and support for Central United Methodist Church and the surrounding community.




New Testament Stories from the Backside A study written by Dr. J. Ellsworth Kalas


