A United Methodist Ministry in Southern Colorado May Mission Focus

We are part of a remarkable story! We at Central first learned about Native Grace in 2019 and have been able to support them in their ministry with several heartwarming projects.

Native Grace is a native American fellowship that holds Sunday worship in the building of the Cortez United Methodist Church. The two congregations work together to support families (especially the elderly) living on the Navajo Reservation in the Four Corners area.

In 2020, we raised funds to purchase replacement propane tanks for homes of the elderly. In 2021, we helped Native Grace to purchase a utility trailer for a new ministry.

We want to continue supporting Native Grace as they offer a place where Christian faith and Native traditions come together ... a place where children can learn about their heritage as they grow to love Jesus Christ.
