Learn just how much God loves and cares for you.





#### **LENTEN WALK 2024**

**DEVOTIONAL FOCUS: Won't You Be My Neighbor?** 

This year's devotional focus is based on the words of Mister Rogers

**WALKING FOCUS: Walk to other Methodist Churches** 

Instead of having a mileage goal, this year is more relaxed and there's no specific walking goal for each week...instead, we'd like to walk in our neighborhoods to another Methodist Church!

#### PLEASE COME JOIN IN THE FUN!

#### Focus #1: Community

Bible Verses: Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor; if either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say – "It's not my child, not my community, not my problem". Then there are those who see the need and respond. I consider those people my heroes."

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Walk around your neighborhood and pick up trash.

#### Focus #2: Love your neighbors

Bible Verses: Matthew 22:37-40 Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: "Love your neighbor as yourself, All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "You know, I think everybody longs to be loved and longs to know that he or she is lovable. And, consequently, the greatest thing we can do is to help somebody know that they are loved and capable of loving."

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Smile, wave, and say hello to every neighbor you see.

#### Focus #3: Love one another

Bible Verse: 1 Thessalonians 5:11 Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "I believe that appreciation is a holy thing, that when we look for what's best in the person we happen to be with at the moment, we're doing what God does - so in appreciating our neighbor, we're participating in something truly sacred."

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Tell at least 5 people what you appreciate about them.

#### Focus #4: Contentment

Bible Verse: Hebrews 13:5 Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "What do you think it is that drives people to want far more than they could ever use or need? I frankly think it is insecurity. How do we let the world know that the trappings of this life are not things that are ultimately important for being accepted?"

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Purge items that you no longer need. Donate usable food items to a local food bank.

#### Focus #5: Love in action

Bible Verse: 1 John 3: 18 Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "The real issue in life is not how many blessings we have, but what we do with our blessings. Some people have many blessings and hoard them. Some have few and give everything away."

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Think of ways you can put a little more love into the world and then do it!

#### Focus #6: Kindness

Bible Verse: Ephesians 4:32 Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "Being kind means responding to the needs of others – and people can be kind, no matter how old or young we are."

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Find one way to be kind – you get to decide what that action will be.

#### Focus #7: Be still

Bible Verse: Psalm 46:10 He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted on the earth."

Words of Wisdom from Mr. Rogers: "Our society is much more interested in information that wonder, in noise rather than silence......and I feel that we need a lot more wonder and a lot more silence in our lives."

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR CHALLENGE: Take some time to just sit, be still, and listen for God's voice.
